I was not able to put pressure on the leg, and was in a wheelchair for about three months. We knew it got badly twisted, since I fell forward with my foot caught, but landed on my back. The doctors checked for breaks in the knee, but nothing seemed broken. We all thought it was a bad sprain. But, God.... One night, when I shifted my weight in the recliner, I heard a loud snap, and my leg and kneecap shifted to the left and clicked in. It must have been out of place. The bulge of bone under my knee was less, but still there. The knee started to feel better. Then, a few weeks later, I shifted position in the recliner and heard a loud snap in my ankle. Now, the bone bulge was gone. The ankle must have been dislocated and clicked back in place. The knee pain is just about gone, and the knee now looks normal. I am walking on the leg with the walker. My ankle is healing, and the doctor said he thinks 12 months is the appropriate recovery time. I know God is working, through the doctor, and through the mighty works of God. God helped and guided the doctor with the surgery, and corrected the rest Himself. He is the Great Physician and perfect Healer. He has blessed me through this. He has shown me His mighty works through this accident, and I am very thankful. I praise Him for who He is, and I am so thankful for all that He is teaching me through this. Praise be to God.
