

Hebrews 12:2-3 (NIV) Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

It is still hard to envision that our Loving Lord, who was (and is) the perfect embodiment of love, peace and truth, endured a brutal cross with its shame, scorn, and killing pain (1 John 3:1). He who knew no sin became sin for us (2 Corinthians 5:21), and we can hardly take it in. Imagine the One (Jesus) who was (and is) eternally pleasing to the Father became an object of His wrath and judgement so that we might be purchased on the cross (1 Corinthians 6:20).

God in His unrestrained, limitless love for humanity gave His One and Only Son, and then Christ would tell His followers to go and love others just as He had loved them (John 13:34). How is this possible? Oh, that Jesus will help us to learn how to love others with His sacrificial love.

While we focus on the cross, the writer of Hebrews invites us to look beyond the finality of the cross onto the resurrection. Considering what Jesus endured on the cross for us will help us find renewed hope and courage for the trials that we face enabling us not to grow weary or lose heart! As the Father raised the Son, so too will He raise those who believe upon Him (Romans 8:11).

How to Think When Life Gets Difficult

Have you ever noticed that being upset about your problems never changes them? A bad attitude is like a flat tire. If you don't change it, you won't go anywhere.

It is more difficult to think and speak positively during the "winters" or hard times of our life, but it's helpful to remember that spring always follows winter. A favorite saying in our family is "This too shall pass." Perhaps you are having a financial difficulty, relationship problems, or illness. It is not possible to live life trouble-free, but it is possible to look for spring in the middle of it. It is very helpful during difficult times to remember that they won't last forever.

God has equipped and anointed us to do hard things. He allows us to go through difficulty to bring glory to Him. He shows Himself strong through us. He told Paul that His strength was made perfect in our weakness (see 1 Corinthians 12:9). We may think we can't make it through tough times, but those thoughts are inaccurate according to God's Word. He has promised to never allow more to come on us than we can bear as we rely on Him (I Corinthians 10:13).

Even when our circumstances don't make us happy, we can choose thoughts that will. When I am in the midst of difficulty, I often turn to Romans 8:35-39, and I remind myself that no matter how difficult life is, God loves me.

During tough times, it's easy to think, I can't do this; it is just too much; it is too hard. Watch for that type of thinking and when you recognize it, remember that it is a lie. Then replace it with a God-inspired thought like, I can do what I need to do because God is with me. This winter season in my life will be over and spring will come.

Make the Mind Connection: During difficult times, avoid thinking the worst and start thinking about what God says.





"The Remedy for a Troubled Heart"

"Do not let your heart be troubled; believe in God, believe also in Me." (John 14:1)

Consider. On the evening before his death, Jesus spoke with his disciples. Jesus told his disciples that he was about to leave them (John 13:33). Naturally, their hearts filled with sorrow (John 16:5-6).

Jesus had already told his listeners who he was. "I and the Father are one" (John 10:30). "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was born, I am" (John 8:58, Exodus 3:6, Exodus 3:14).

As the remedy for *their* troubled hearts, Jesus asked his disciples to *believe* in him. The Greek word for "believe" is *pisteuó*, which means *have faith in, trust in* (Ref. 1).

As the remedy for *our* troubled hearts, Jesus asks us to *believe* in him. Jesus asks us to *trust him* and to *have faith in him*.

The remedy for a troubled heart is to believe in Jesus.

To the father of the boy who was deaf, mute, and had seizures, Jesus said, "All things are possible for the one who believes and trusts [in Me]!" (verse 23 in Mark 9:14-29)

To the woman who touched Jesus' cloak and was healed, Jesus said, "Daughter, your faith [your personal trust and confidence in Me] has restored you to health; go in peace and be [permanently] healed from your suffering" (Mark 5:34).

To his disciples, Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; My [perfect] peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be afraid. [Let My perfect peace calm you in every circumstance and give you courage and strength for every challenge.]" (John 14:27).

Listen. I encourage you to listen to Louis Armstrong's recording of the African-American spiritual song, "Nobody Knows the Trouble I've Seen."

Apply. Is something troubling your heart today? Will you choose to believe in Jesus?


