

Philippians 4:10 –13 (ESV) I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at length you have revived your concern for me. You were indeed concerned for me, but you had no opportunity. Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. can do all things through him who strengthens me.

This is one of my all-time favorite passages. It speaks of the truth and reality of doing all things in Christ's strength! It is straight forward and simple, yet I find myself needing to return to its truths, after allowing stress, worry, fears, and doubt in. As followers maturing in Christ, this is an awesome truth that we can return to time and time again. It seems that Paul had found a place of remaining in Christ regardless of what he was going though.

Part of Paul's victory was learning to be content in all things. Although we might think of him as independent and a loner, we find the opposite as he is often asking others to pray for him and as we read above, appreciating the value of their concern for him. What I find interesting is that although he learned the "secret" of being content and dependent on God's strength and provision, he still understands the importance of relationships and the support they bring.

God has called us to be a Body, Fellowship, Bride, Holy Priesthood, Living Stones, Ambassadors, Salt and Light. As we acknowledge that he is all we need, we also need to acknowledge the value and call that he has placed on the Church and the command not to forsake meeting with each other (Hebrews 10:35). We need the Lord... and we need each other. I think this is going to be more evident in the coming days as our world seems to be slipping into greater darkness and decay.

Take time this summer to pray for one another and to get to know each other better. Lunch after church, dinner, phone calls, texts and visits can enhance our lives and relationships. Staying in the Word and following it commands can also keep us focused and remaining in Christ. Rejoicing in the Lord's strength and for the fellowship at FBCG! Blessings and love, P. Carl

Looking to Jesus and God's word to give us examples of where to pray, when to pray and how to pray

WHERE WHEN HOW

- Matt. 14:23 "He went up into the hills by himself to pray"
- Mark 1:35 "Before daybreak the next morning, Jesus got up and went out to an isolated place."
- Luke 5:16 "But Jesus often withdrew to the wilderness for prayer."
- Luke 6:12 "...Jesus went on a mountain to pray, and he prayed to God all night."

Again here are only a few verses that show us Jesus' life. As we desire His direction and help when we pray, Jesus does the same to the heavenly Father. Jesus prays openly and honestly. In John 12:27, Jesus says to the Father how deeply troubled his soul is and how Jesus called out to God the Father at his crucifixion.

OTHER PLACES PRAYED or CAN PRAY

- in a fish Jonah 2:1 - "Then Jonah prayed to the Lord his God from inside the fish."

- in prison Acts 16:25 - "Around midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God."

- on knees Daniel 6:10 - "But when Daniel learned that the law had been signed, he went home and knelt down as usual in his upstairs room, with its windows opened toward Jerusalem. He prayed three times a day just as he had always done, giving thanks to his God."

- neighborhood walks, lawn mower, closet, dr. office, ss, church, grocery store, etc., etc.

JESUS PRAYERS AND TEACHING

- Luke 22:32 - "But I have pleaded in prayer for you, Simon, that your faith should not fail. So when you have repented and turned to me again, strengthen your brothers."

- John 17:9 - "My prayer is not for the world, but for those you have given me, because they belong to you."

- Matthew 6:9-13 & Luke 11:1-10 This is the Lord's Prayer. There's more teaching after this prayer about keeping on or not giving up. The examples are keep on asking, keep on seeking, keep on knocking.

- Matthew 19:13&15 - "One day some parents brought their children to Jesus so he could lay his hands on them and pray for them and he placed his hands on their heads and blessed them before he left."

- Matthew 26:39 - "He went on a little further and bowed with his face to the ground, praying, my Father if it is possible let this cup of suffering be taken away from me. Yet I want your will to be done, not mine."

All of these verses talking about prayer does not mean much if Jesus is not your savior. I urge you to take in Psalm 32 and speak to one of the pastors and/or elders.

The ACPM provides a ministry for its inmates. Chaplain Perez creates a weekly newsletter that is delivered to all cell blocks. It contains a bible study guide, an announcement section, a book recommendation from their library, and a family and marriage enrichment section.

Chaplain Perez is also trying to restart the volunteer program or possibly an external volunteer program. He's been trying to develop programs to reach inmates without entering the facility. Please contact the Chaplain if you are interested in this program.

Chaplain Perez asks if you wish to pray for the ACPM that you could pray like this: Sunday- for God's grace upon Adams County Monday- for God's wisdom on the commissioners of Adams County Tuesday- for inmates and their families Wednesday- for correctional officers and their families Thursday- for the warden and deputy officers Friday- for the leadership of ACPM Saturday- for the staff, contractors, and support staff at ACPM

C.A.R.E.S.

Stands for combined area resources for emergency shelter. It is a cold weather shelter program for the homeless. CARES has a resource center where guests can do laundry, take showers, access a computer, meet with support staff, apply for jobs, and try to improve their quality of life. During the cold months of October through April some 14 churches provide a place to sleep and a breakfast.



The FBC Mission Board is sponsoring a dinner on August 2nd for members of the Restoring Hope Cycling Team. Restoring Hope is a ministry partner of Cornerstone Church. They are committed to helping brothers and sisters in Dungu, DRC (Democratic Republic of the Congo) with medical provision, trauma healing, education, agricultural initiatives, and other sustainable endeavors.
