Pastor's January 2022 Newsletter

For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb.
I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.
My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place. When I was woven together in the depths of the earth, your eyes saw my unformed body. All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be. **Psalm 139:13-16 (NIV)**

In response to the January 22, 1973, decision by the U.S. Supreme Court to legalize abortion-on-demand in all 50 states, on January 13, 1984, President Ronald Reagan issued a proclamation designating January 22 as the first National Sanctity of Human Life Day. Today, churches around the United States still use this day to mourn and remember the over 62 million lives that have been lost to abortion since its legalization in 1973.

This issue is important for us as followers of Christ because we understand the value of all human life (regardless of color, age, gender, race or creed). Made in the image of God (Genesis 1:26), humanity is wonderfully created and knitted together (139:13-140) by our Creator who has some amazing plans for each person to fulfill (Ephesians 2:10). Made a little lower than the angels (Hebrews 2:7), God, in Christ, has crowned us with glory and honor. Even though sin has brought death and separation (Romans 6:23a), God has made it possible for us to be reconciled with him through belief upon the atoning sacrifice of His Son Jesus Christ (John 3:16, Romans 6:23b). Christ is our only true Hope in this world!

As Christ followers, we do not have the liberty to look the other way, trying to smooth things over by making this issue about "choice," "a woman's body or rights," or "viability." God's created design for bringing a child into the world begins at conception; END this process at any stage, and you end that LIFE. Commanding us not to kill (Exodus 20:13), the Lord calls us to be an advocate for the defenseless (Psalms 82:3-4, Isaiah 1:17, James 1:27) of which babies are of the most vulnerable and without voice. Though some celebrate legalized abortion as a win for women's rights, I pray we can see it as a tragic loss and a devaluation of all human life. For those who live with the regret of having an abortion, remember God is rich in love and forgiveness.

The Lord spoke to the prophet Jeremiah telling him that he, "Knew him before he was formed" in his mother's womb (Jeremiah 1:4-5). This verse challenges our thinking as to just when the "viability" of Jeremiah actually began! While the Supreme Court hears arguments that may threaten the constitutional right to abortion, might I suggest that our response be one of ardent and humble prayer. Let us respond to the abortion issue with Christ's love, compassion, and humble discussion about the value of all humanity including those who are unborn. May we also be willing to support young mothers through our prayers, time, resources, and care. We also need to help undergird ministries like Tender Care Pregnancy Center which offers support to young moms, including sonograms that often reveal that the child inside them is not just random tissue, but a living, growing child of God. May the Lord have mercy on us and help us to care and protect the unborn.

Retaliating With Sin

*That old law about 'an eye for an eye' leaves everybody blind. The time is always right to do the right thing. —
Martin Luther King, Jr.*

Revenge appeals to our flesh. We want to retaliate when someone's done something to hurt or offend us. We want to "get back" at them and show them what it feels like, so we say or do something to them hoping we can experience some relief.

Take a married couple, for example. One spouse does something to hurt the other. It could be something like hurtful words during a fight or it could be marital unfaithfulness. The other spouse has a choice in how they respond. They either show grace and forgive, or they say the words or break the trust because it was done to them.

Rarely do people feel better when they handle their own revenge. All it does is stir up an insatiable appetite for more revenge. When we allow someone else's sin against us to determine if we will sin back, we've given them power over our choices. And retaliating with more sin hurts the heart of God *first*.

The toxic cycle goes like this: *someone hurts us, we hurt them back with our sin, we sin against God, and then maybe the person is hurt*. There's no guarantee that our retaliation will hurt the person we intended to hurt, but it will *always* go against our God.

We think that stooping to the level of the person who hurt us is actually going to bring us comfort. It never does. And to make the entire situation worse, we know that God is not pleased and has called us to a higher standard.

Instead of retaliating, what if we said to ourselves, "*I'm not going to retaliate because I don't want to sin against God*"? Let's allow our love and devotion to God to keep us from retaliating with more sin.

Everyone has something they are going through at any given time in their lives. Things that cause us great pain, which in turn leads us to do things we didn't think we would do. Sometimes all we need to do is walk away, forgive, and pray for the person who hurt us. But for those whom we cherish and walk through life with, we can choose to empathize and show grace, for that will enlarge our hearts for the people God loves so deeply.

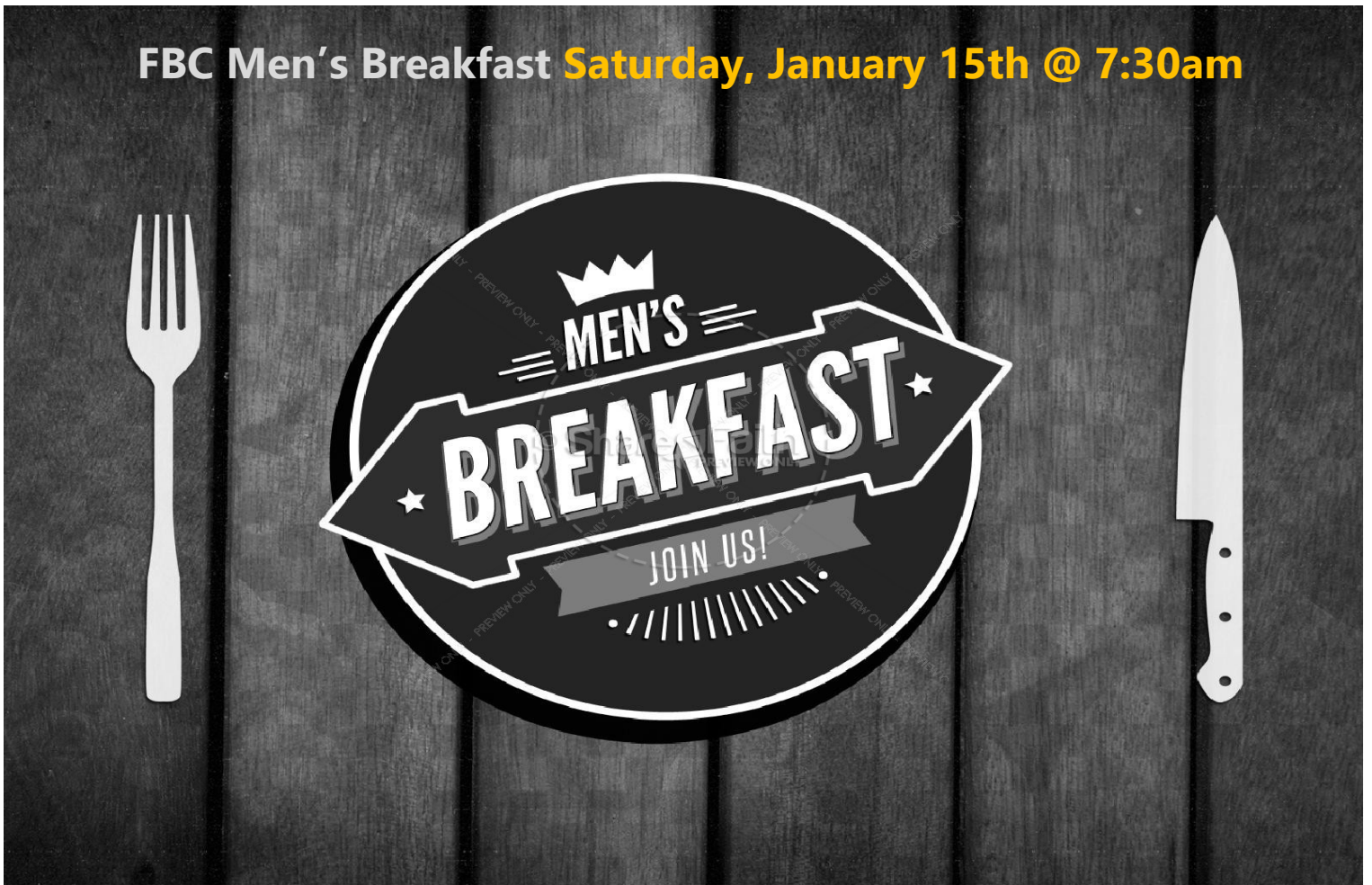

THE BIBLE HAS THE ANSWER

Since this is the start of a new year, I thought that it would be appropriate to write about hope and try to provide encouragement to everyone. I know from speaking with many of you that 2021 has been a hard year. Yet we have all of God's promises in His Word. I know having lost Linda that the promise of us being united in heaven with Jesus is looking better all the time. The Rapture cannot happen too soon.

The following are illustrations / stories taken from a book put out by Dave Branon of Our Daily Bread under the title of "A STORY IS TOLD."

May they be a blessing to you!

STOLEN CAR? - Read Matt. 5:16 – Joe Stowell tells the story of a stressed-out woman who was tail-gating a man as they drove on a busy boulevard. When the man slowed to a stop at a yellow light, the woman hit the horn, cussing, and screaming in frustration and gesturing angrily. As she was still in mid-rant, she heard a tap on her window and looked up into the face of a police officer, who ordered her to exit the car with her hands up.. He took her to the police station and placed her in a holding cell.

An hour later, the officer returned and said, "I'm sorry, Ma'am. This has been a big mistake. When I pulled up behind you, I noticed your "What Would Jesus Do?" license plate holder and your "Follow Me To Sunday School" bumper sticker. Seeing the way you were acting, I assumed the car was stolen.

THE TESTS OF CRITICISM - Read Proverbs 27:6 – After a church service in which the minister had preached about spiritual gifts, he was greeted at the door by a woman who said, "Pastor, I believe I have the gift of criticism."

He responded, "Do you remember the person in Jesus' parable who had the one talent? Do you recall what he did with it?" "Yes" replied the woman, "he went out and buried it" (Matt. 25:18).

With a smile the pastor suggested, "Go and do likewise!"

BIG CHANGES – Read 2 Corinthians 5:17 – Tremendous changes occur when a person becomes a new creature in Christ. Evangelist D.L. Moody enumerated the major points in that life-altering transaction and wrote them on the flyleaf of his Bible.

1. Justification: a change of standing BEFORE GOD, 2. Regeneration: a change of nature FROM GOD, 3. Repentance: a change of mind ABOUT GOD, 4. Conversion: a change of life FOR GOD,
5. Adoption: a change of family IN GOD, 6. Sanctification: a changed of service TO GOD, 7. Glorification: a change of place WITH GOD.

LINCOLN'S FAITH: Read Luke 24:26 – Abraham Lincoln was a backwoodsman who rose from humble beginnings to the heights of political power. During the dark days of the U.S. Civil War, he served as a compassionate and resolute president. Depression and mental pain were his frequent companions. Yet the terrible emotional suffering he endured drove him to receive Jesus Christ by faith.

Lincoln told a crowd in his hometown in Illinois: "When I left Springfield, I asked the people to pray for me; I was not a Christian. When I buried my son, the severest trial of my life, I was not a Christian. But when I saw the graves of thousands of our soldiers, I then and there consecrated myself to Christ. I do love Jesus."

Life's most painful tragedies can bring us to a deeper understanding of the savior.

QUOTE FROM LEWIS SPERRY CHAFER: Salvation is the work of God for man; It is not the work of man for God.

QUOTE FROM BILLY GRAHAM: The entire plan for the future has its key in the resurrection.

EMPTY PROOF – Read I Corinthians 15:4: In the days of the French Revolution, a man tried to start a new religion that he believed was superior to Christianity. But he was disappointed at his lack of success. He revealed his frustration to a clergyman and asked what he could do.

The clergyman replied that it was no easy task to begin a new religion – so difficult that he had nothing to suggest. But after a moment's reflection, he said, "There's one plan that you might want to consider. Why don't you get yourself crucified and rise again the third day?"

The firm foundation of the Christian faith is an empty tomb.

A SENSE OF PURPOSE – Read Nehemiah 10:29: In 1722, Jonathan Edwards drew up a list of seventy resolutions, dedicating himself to live in harmony with God and others. The following resolutions give a picture of the serious purpose with which Edwards approached his relationship with God. He resolved: (1) To do whatever is most to God's glory. (2) To do my duty for the good of mankind in general. (3) Never to do anything which I should be afraid to do if it were the last hour of my life. (4) To study the Scriptures steadily, constantly, and frequently. (5) To ask myself at the end of every day, week, month and year if I could possibly have done better. (6) Until I die, not to act as if I were my own, but entirely and altogether God's.

A SURPRISE ANSWER – Read I John 3:22: When Josh McDowell's mother died, he was not sure of her salvation. He became depressed. Was she a Christian or not? "Lord," he prayed, "Somehow give me the answer so I can get back to normal. I've just got to know." It seemed like an impossible request.

Two days later, Josh drove out to the ocean and walked to the end of a pier to be alone. There sat an elderly woman in a lawn chair, fishing. "Where's your home originally?" she asked.

"Michigan. "Union City," Josh replied. "nobody's heard of it" I tell people it's a suburb of-----". "Battle Creek," interrupted the woman. "I had a cousin from there. Did you know the McDowell family?"

Stunned, Josh responded, "Yes, I am Josh McDowell."

"I can't believe it" said the woman. "I'm a cousin to your mother."

"Do you remember anything at all about my mother's spiritual life?" asked Josh.

"Why sure. Your mom and I were just girls-teenagers – when a tent revival came to town. We both went forward to accept Christ."

"Praise God!" shouted Josh, startling the surrounding fishermen.

God delights to give us what we ask when it is in His will.

THE FORGOTTEN BOOK – Read Psalm 119:93: A young boy noticed a large black book covered with dust lying on a high shelf. His curiosity was aroused, so he asked his mother about it. Embarrassed, she hastily explained, "That's a Bible. It's God's book." The boy thought for a moment and then said, "Well, if that's God's book, why don't we give it back to Him? Nobody around here uses it anyway."

elder's corner

Another year has come and gone and where do we stand? The Barna Group released a new survey looking at the changes among church attendance after the COVID-19 pandemic grew in the US. The result: Research has revealed that **one in three practicing Christians has stopped attending church services**. FBCG is no exception to this statistic. We have also seen a similar drop in our attendance. This drop has led to strain in multiple ways. Those who have faithfully volunteered have been called on to volunteer all the more. Financial contributions have dropped. Dear friends are missing from our fellowship.

With these pains, among others, there are great temptations among us. There is the temptation to become frustrated. There is the temptation to become aggravated. There is the temptation to be discouraged to the point of giving up. There is the temptation to modify our services and ministries to “make them more attractive”. There is also the temptation to blame others for things they cannot control. Satan is using discomfort to pull us all the more apart from the body of Christ. My dear brothers and sisters, **this must not be!**

We must continually remind ourselves that this is not about us. If you have felt these temptations to grumble, give up, or change our ministry, remember that these things are directly because of spiritual warfare. Paul reminds us to be ready to do battle against Satan. “Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm (Eph. 6:10-13).” If you are feeling malice towards one of your brethren or a program that is not producing what you hope, remember that Satan is using that to tear us apart. Let us come together and unite in one spiritual phalanx under one Spirit of God. “I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call— one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift (Eph. 4: 1-7).”


You all have remained as wheat that falls to the ground while the chaff is blown away. You have endured. Keep fighting the good fight! “And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up (Gal. 6:9).” There is more to come so be prepared to endure all the more! “But recall the former days when, after you were enlightened, you endured a hard struggle with sufferings, sometimes being publicly exposed to reproach and affliction, and sometimes being partners with those so treated. For you had compassion on those in prison, and you joyfully accepted the plundering of your property, since you knew that you yourselves had a better possession and an abiding one. Therefore do not throw away your confidence, which has a great reward. For you need endurance, so that when you have done the will of God you may receive what is promised. For,

“Yet a little while,
and the coming one will come and will not delay;
but my righteous one shall live by faith,
and if he shrinks back,
my soul has no pleasure in him.”

But we are not of those who shrink back and are destroyed, but of those who have faith and preserve their souls. (Heb. 10:32-39)

Brothers and sisters, the elders are united in that we will continue the ministry Jesus has set before us. For it is not our clever schemes that build the church, it is Christ alone that this church is built on. This church is “built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord. In him, you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit (Eph. 2:20-22).” Remember that Christ is not just the only thing we need; He is the only thing we have. If you do not think this way, this is the problem. We must not be concerned about church growth and membership numbers, we need to focus on our holiness in Christ! Forget about new gimmicks or new ideas to grow our church. Our sights must be readjusted to bring us back in alignment with Jesus. We must continue to be uncompromising in the Gospel of Jesus for it is the only thing that matters in life. Christ alone is our purpose. We strive to tell the world that they, too, may be saved through Jesus’ grace. So, brothers and sisters, do not be discouraged. Do not be dismayed. For the Lord our God is with us wherever we go (Josh. 1:9). Endure. For in due time, you will reap a harvest at the coming of our Lord.
