What comes to mind when we say "PRAYER"?

Are we thinking "I can't do that" or "that is what our pastors and elders do".

Or can we trust, believe, and know that God's word is true. Just as our lives in Christ require us to be alert and steadfast, our prayer life needs to be the same. My hope is that these verses will cause you to walk closer with the Lord and trust in His word.

TRUST

1 Chronicles 5:20 "They cried out to God during the battle and He answered their prayer because they trusted in Him."

During our battles when we cry out to God, are we trusting in Him to answer our prayers? I see later on in this chapter the same people that trusted God became unfaithful. More reason for God's people to be alert and steadfast.

PRAYER LIFE

Ephesians 6:18 "Pray in the spirit at all times and on every occasion. Stay alert and be persistent in your prayers for all believers everywhere."

God's word is amazing. The verses before this talk about putting on every piece of the whole armor of God so we can be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power because our fight is not against flesh and blood.

1 Thessalonians 5:17 "Pray continually" : "Never stop praying."

2 Thessalonians 1:11 "So we keep on praying for you asking our God to enable you to live a life worthy of His call."

WORSHIP

Paul, in 1 Timothy, gives instruction about worship, giving us a glimpse of what our prayer/ worship should be. So important and necessary to give all over to God.

1 Timothy 2:8 "In every place of worship I want men to pray with holy hands lifted up to God, free from anger and controversy."

1 Timothy 2:1-2 "I urge you first of all, to pray for all people. Ask God to help them. Intercede on their behalf, and give thanks for them. Pray this way for kings and all who are in authority so that we can live peaceful and quiet lives marked by godliness and dignity." Isn't it good to know that God is near to us? We know this even more when we pray and talk to Him.

Deuteronomy 4:7 "For what great nation has a god near to them as the Lord our God is near to us whenever we call on him."

2 Chronicles 7:14 "Then if my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sins and restore their land." (TO BE CONTINUED)
