Volunteers can sign up in the foyer to help during one or more time slots.

Our time at the Shoebox Processing Center near Baltimore is on Nov. 26, or Dec. 3. This is where a team of volunteers checks each box to be sure it passes both OCC and custom's requirements. We can go as a group or individually. We would leave around 7am and return around 5pm. Preregistration is required. elder's corner

The purpose of the Elder Board as you folks already know is to guard the spiritual life of the church. But do you also know that as individual believers you and I are to take a stand for Christ every day of our lives. This is very important and you and I can make a difference in the lives of people we know and meet.

Taking a stand for Christ can cost us – financially, physically and spiritually. We need to have the attitude of the apostle Paul: For to me to live is Christ and to die is gain. (Philippians 1:21). Paul reminds us in 1:26 that we are to let our conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ. Here are some examples:

About 150 years ago there was a great revival in the country of Wales. As a result of this many missionaries came to north -east India to share the gospel. To this region known as Assam came American Baptist Missionaries to hundreds of tribes known for being aggressive head-hunters. Of course they were not well received.

However one of these missionaries led a man, his wife and two sons to faith in Jesus Christ. As a result this man and his wife began leading other villagers to accept Jesus. This angered the village chief who called all the villagers together. He then called the family who had first converted to Jesus to renounce their new found faith in public. The man refused to renounce his faith. He told the chief "I have decided to follow Jesus." This made the chief so mad that he ordered his archers to kill the man's two sons.

The chief of the village gave him another chance to reject Jesus and the man said "though no one joins me still I will follow. Though no one joins me still I will follow. Though no one joins me still I will follow. No turning back, no turning back. This so enraged the chief he ordered his wife to be killed with a bow and arrow also.

The chief gave him one more opportunity to renounce his faith in Christ. He replied, "The cross before me, the world behind me. The cross before me, the world behind me. The cross before me, the world behind me. No turning back, no turning back."

He had his archers kill him with their arrows. But then a miracle took place. The chief who had this man and his whole family killed wondered" why should a man die for a Man who lived in a far-away place 2000 years ago on another continent. There must be some remarkable power behind this family's faith, and I too want to taste that faith."

The chief then declared "I too belong to Jesus Christ!" When the crowd heard this from the mouth of their chief, the whole village accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior.

It was the last words from this man known as Nokseng from the Garo tribe of Assam that formed the basis for the song used for many years at Billy Graham's Crusades known as "I Have Decided To Follow Jesus.

We have been studying the book of Daniel in Bible Fellowship class on Sunday mornings. This past week we looked at chapter three where Daniel's three friends were thrown in a furnace for refusing to bow down and worship an idol. They too were asked to compromise their faith and refused to do so. Look at this story from World War II about Paul Schneider and look at the similarity.

He was a pastor in the "Confessing Church" in Germany. The people making up this church believed the Bible to be the inspired Word of God and consisted of people like Dietrich Bonhoeffer and Martin Neimoller. They did not give in to the Nazi's request to go along with Hitler's program.

Pastor Schneider had grown up being taught the Bible was full of errors and could not be trusted. In 1921 as he began his theological studies he realized that the great reformers, Martin Luther and John Calvin were right: man is a sinner in need of redemption. He saw that Biblical salvation was by repentance and faith in the crucified and risen Christ.

Pastors Schneider and Neimoller shared the dubious distinction of being Hitler's personal prisoners, meaning that he had personally signed the order to silence them.

Pastor Schneider refused to say "heil Hitler" since he considered that worship of an idol. He was asked one time to bow to the Nazi flag and refused to bow. For that he was whipped twenty-five times with a oxhide whip, thrown into a cell (4 feet by 10 feet) and bleeding for 15 months. All he received was bread and water. He had no furniture, no electric light and was not allowed a Bible.

One Sunday in 1938 he preached to prisoners through his cell window and within a few minutes the prison guards pulled him away from the window bars, tied him to a rack and gave him 25 more lashes with a leather whip. Schneider told a friend "Somebody has to preach God's Word in this hell."

A few months later Pastor Schneider did the same thing and received another 25 lashes.

For telling a guard the truth in answer to his question he was suspended by his wrists from the window bars, with his feet off the floor for hours.

Finally the Nazi's realized he was not about to cooperate with them. All he would have to do was sign a document saying he supported the Nazi regime and he would have been released. So a prison doctor injected him with an overdose of "strophanthin", a drug used to treat cardiac insufficiency and killed him.

In the last few years we have had Barronelle Stutzman, a florist who had served a gay customer for 10 years but refused to do flowers for his gay wedding. For this she was sued by the Attorney General for the state of Washington and the ACLU (American Civil Liberties Union).

Also in the state of Washington, a football coach, named Joe Kennedy, was fired by his high school administrators for refusing to stop praying on the football field following games and practices with willing players.

Finally, there is Jack Phillips who bakes cakes for a living in Colorado. He is the owner of Masterpiece Cakeshop and refused to design a cake for a same-sex marriage ceremony. He won his case in 2018 in the U.S. Supreme Court. But was sued again for refusing to make a cake for a gender-transition.

The above cases have yet to be settled. But remember 2 passages of Scripture from Hebrews 10:23 – He who promised is faithful and 10:38, "the just shall live by faith."

Remember we are doing spiritual warfare. We need to support one another and especially uplift our pastors in prayer. Romans 8:31 says if God is for us who can be against us. Let us always strive to do the right thing decently and in order (I Corinthians 14:40).
